St. Louis (March 1st, 2017) – GlobalSTL, an initiative of BioSTL, is honored to welcome a delegation of 12 innovative Israeli agriculture technology companies to St. Louis. In partnership with the Government of Israel Economic Mission and BIRD Foundation (the Israel-U.S. Binational Research & Development Fund), GlobalSTL will host these companies on Monday, March 6.

at the Donald Danforth Plant Science Center from noon to 4 p.m. The event includes lunch with two keynote speakers: Chris Chinn, Director of the Missouri Department of Agriculture, and Dr. Nicholas Kalaitzandonakes, MSMC Endowed Chair of Agribusiness Strategy at the University of Missouri. Following lunch, each of the twelve Israeli companies will deliver a short pitch before breaking into one-on-one meetings between the companies and members of the Midwest Ag-tech community.

"This is an opportunity to build on the considerable success of GlobalSTL, having attracted 5 Israeli ag-tech companies to establish their North American presence in St. Louis in just the last two years. We look forward to connecting these 12 companies to world-class ag-innovation assets and influential Ag-tech leaders across the Midwest," said Mr. Vijay Chauhan, GlobalSTL lead. "When companies visit, they experience St. Louis'

impressive Ag Ecosystem and the business value we deliver for them through our relationships with leading seed and crop chemical companies, venture capital firms, farmers' groups, supply-chain and processing companies."

The Israeli delegation includes companies specializing in such areas as crop protection, crop nutrition, plant genetics and breeding, irrigation, and decision support tech. The AgTech Innovation Event is the latest in a series of Global STL's forward-thinking initiatives that provides a win-win-win approach to growing St. Louis' economy. By bringing international, innovation-focused companies to St. Louis, GlobalSTL provides innovation & business value to St. Louis corporations, prized customers and partners to global companies and high-paying jobs to the St. Louis regional economy. Most recently, GlobalSTL brought Israeli company Atomation to St. Louis, where it is developing an energy-saving pilot program for Ameren.
